Tip of the Month

In case you didn't know, manufacturers of watercolor pigment make up names for their colors, so different brands have different names. To make sure you are using the same color whether it's DaVinci, Windsor Newton, Daniel Smith, Holbein, or Schmincke, check the pigment code and number on the tube.

For example, Daniel Smith's *Hansa Yellow Medium* is PY 97 (i.e., pigment yellow 97). This same color made by Windsor Newton is called *Transparent Yellow*; and *Arylide Yellow FGL* by DaVinci. Check your pigment color code to make sure you're getting what you want.
