experiment with those luscious watercolors? Then you'll want to try *Discovering Yupo*. This is not your mother's Yupo. Our March two-day workshop led by Chica Brunsvold, AWS, NWS, will set you free to explore flowing watercolors and develop new textures and images in your work.

Leave your photos and sketches at home. No

preconceived ideas are necessary. See what surprises transpire when your paint hits the paper. You'll definitely want to try this compelling and unique alternative to traditional watercolor paper.

Join us on Monday and Tuesday, March 2 and 3, 2015, from 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day at the Lewes Library, 111 Adams Ave, Lewes, DE 19958, (302) 645-2733. There is a modest fee of \$130 for members; \$155 for non-members. Space is limited to 20 only, so sign up early, either online or by using the form at the end of the newsletter. A materials list will be sent prior to the workshop.


Member News
