## Our June Workshop Was a Success

Joyce Hicks' June watercolor workshop was an enjoyable learning opportunity for the participants. Hicks, a signature member of the American Watercolor Society and a self-taught artist, graciously shared her art experiences. To prove that we can all reach our goals as artists, she was happy to share paintings from the

beginning of her career, what she calls her "wallpaper phase"— full of enthusiasm but lacking all the principles and elements of design. After two years of this, Hicks decided to "actually read" her art books rather than trying to duplicate the images. She found a wealth of information and practiced each element and principle until she was confident with her ability. She strongly abides by these when describing and developing her works.



Through live demonstrations, Hicks walked everyone through the creation of luminous colors, the use of a palette knife to add texture, negative painting, and her signature calligraphy used as part of her design.

She also worked with each member to develop a design using a black and white image. Her first questions were, "What does this image convey to you? Why do you want to paint it?" From there, she helped each attendee select the important shapes and how to use these to design a painting emphasizing the principles and elements of design.

Each student received a treasured value study drawn and signed by Joyce Hicks. Her generous spirit and willingness to share her knowledge kept each of the students engaged. At the end of the workshop, she showed that spirit again by raffling off the work she created during her demo. What a special treat for all.
