Ellen Elmes' paintings have been acclaimed for their unique, collage-style blend of symbolic imagery and flowing naturalism. A watercolor artist, muralist, author of her memoir *An Appalachian Labyrinth: Painting to the Center,* and retired community college teacher, Elmes has enjoyed decades of creative exploration with her husband Don from atop Jewell Ridge in the Appalachian Mountains of Southwest Virginia.

Ellen Elmes' love of artmaking has sustained her over the last 50 years through the creation of what she calls her "soul paintings" in the watercolor medium, and visual renderings of community stories in over 30 public murals. A Sustaining Member of the Virginia Watercolor Society, she has exhibited her watercolors extensively in her Central Appalachian region and in many of the Mid-Atlantic states. As a muralist, Ellen has designed and painted numerous large-scale murals in Maryland, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Virginia; as well as having supervised the painting of collaborative, community-created murals in Florida, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia, and at the Allanton Peace Center in Scotland.
